Good news for ratepayers. A previously approved water rate increase starting Jan. 1, 2018, will be lower than expected, saving the average household about \$20 and \$1.7 million districtwide.

The water district's finances have been bolstered by increased efficiencies, strategic financial management and higher than anticipated water sales. Customers benefit because water districts may only charge for the actual cost of providing water service.

FROM BLACK DIAMOND PAVING

Things to Know Before the Project Begins:

- ✓ You will receive a detailed project notice in the mail one week prior to the project – There will also be Project Banners at the entries to the community with a website <u>www.MyPavingProject.com</u> - This website <u>will contain all of the project details and information</u> <u>along with updates and scheduling. VERY</u> <u>IMPORTANT!</u>
- ✓ The QR Code at the bottom of the banner placed at the Entry will lead you directly to the website. (The application which will scan the code from your smart phone can be downloaded for free from the Apple App store or Android Market).
- ✓ Black Diamond Paving will place *No Parking and Road Closed Signs* within the community at the time of the notification posting and will clearly mark out the phase locations using white paint on the road. Remember that any vehicles left parked on the roadways or in parking areas that are to be closed will be towed at owner's expense. *The Road signs will have dates and times!*
- ✓ You will be able to access your homes at all times during the project by foot when a road section is closed during construction.
- ✓ The construction and cleaning process will create some degree of dust and noise – it is advisable to keep your windows closed while crews are working within your area of the community.
- ✓ You will not be able to re-enter the closed section of the community until all barricades have been removed by a Black Diamond Paving representative.
- ✓ Please be careful At times during the asphalt project, you may encounter some delays. Please pay attention to all traffic control communications.

Homeowners and residents, North Coast Patrol (NCP) is contracted by The Cape to provide patrol services within the community at random times each night. As part of the service, they:

- Monitor the pool area and inspect the streets for obvious parking violations
- During the course of NCP's patrols, the community is checked for suspicious activity and vehicles in common areas

Residents may phone NCP to report *non-emergency* matters that may be occurring within the common area of the community. You should dial 911 for any emergency or crime in progress before calling North Coast Patrol.

If residents do not want to phone NCP directly to report suspicious activity or other problems and nuisances in the community, they are encouraged to use their website portal to file online reports, with an option of being anonymous:

Rules Committee—the Rules Committee recommends rules not specifically addressed in the Declaration of Restrictions (CC&Rs) or Bylaws for the preservation of facilities, health, welfare, and recreation of the Association.

Architectural Committee—the Architectural Committee reviews and investigates each request for an architectural change to ensure that the requested change will conform to existing standards of construction and will not distract from the overall esthetics of the community. The committee will consider the effect of the recommended approval on future applicants.
